I write in connection with your request for information dated 18/06/2010, which was received by Greater Manchester Police on 18/06/2010, for the following information:

- 5) How many Police officers were injured?
- 6) Why were the Ranger supporters allowed to purchase alcohol from 8am that day in the city centre, and allowed to consume alcohol in a public place?
- 7) How much did the Policing operation for the day cost ?
- 8) Were Rangers FC billed for the policing cost, and millions of pounds worth damages caused during that day / night ?

Response

Following receipt of your request searches were conducted within Greater Manchester Police to locate information relevant to your request. I can confirm that the information you have requested is held in part by Greater Manchester Police (GMP).

GMP do not hold the requested information, however to comply with section 16 of the Freedom of Information Act (Providing advice and assistance) we can confirm that many Rangers fans brought alcohol with them from their home towns. Furthermore, the sheer numbers prevented enforcement of the Designated public places order.

Question 7. The policing bill was £254.000.

Question 8. Policing costs were recouped from UEFA.

COMPLAINT RIGHTS

Are you unhappy with how your request has been handled or do you think the decision is incorrect?
