**FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST REFERENCE NO: FOI/23/011479/R**

I write in connection with your request for information dated 12/10/2023, received by Greater Manchester Police (GMP) for the following information:

***Under the Freedom of Information Act, could you please tell me for the years 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022 and 2023 [current number as of 12th October]:***

- the number of suspected female suicides attended by police officers where domestic abuse has been a concern/previously recorded [this can be past reports linked to that specific address or individual]***
- if applicable, the number of convictions of a male perpetrator for domestic abuse offences after a woman has taken her own life***

**Result of Searches**

Following receipt of your request searches were conducted within Greater Manchester Police to locate information relevant to your request. I can confirm that the information you have requested is held by Greater Manchester Police. However, I am not obliged to supply the information you have requested as exemption applies.

When refusing to provide such information because an exemption applies, Section 17(1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 requires GMP, to provide you - the applicant - with a notice which: (a) states that fact, (b) specifies the exemption in question and (c) states (if that would not otherwise be apparent) why the exemption applies.

The requested information is exempt under **section 21 – Information accessible to applicant by other means**. The information referred to is already available in the Public Domain. Please follow the link below.

## **Results**

Suicides where there was previous domestic abuse history are captured by a Domestic Homicide Review and are published in the public domain. The information available in the public domain is anonymised but is broken down by force.
