FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST REFERENCE NO: FOI/24/012712/G

I write in connection with your request for information dated 29/05/2024, received by Greater Manchester Police (GMP) for the following information:

Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, I seek the following information:

- 1. What was the cost of the investigation into Angela Rayner that concluded on May 28?*
- 2. If possible, can you break down the cost into the initial factfinding efforts and then the investigation triggered by the complaint from James Daly?*
- 3. If possible, can you detail how many officers worked on the investigation and for how many hours.*

If some parts of this request are easier to answer than others, I would ask that you release the available data as soon as possible.

I would prefer to receive this information electronically, preferably as a data set, eg. in Excel, NOT as a PDF.

If it is not possible to provide the information requested due to the information exceeding the cost of compliance limits identified in section 12 of the act, please provide advice and assistance, under your section 16 obligations, as to how I can refine my request to be included in the scope of the act.

If you need any clarification then please do not hesitate to contact me.

If the decision is made to withhold some of this data using exemptions in the Data Protection Act, please inform me of that fact and cite the exemptions used.

I would be grateful if you could confirm by email that you have received this request, and I look forward to hearing from you within the 20-working day statutory time period.

Result of Searches

Following receipt of your request searches were conducted within Greater Manchester Police (GMP) to locate the requested information and I can confirm the information requested is held by GMP.

However, GMP does not hold the information that you have requested in an easily retrievable format or centrally on a reporting system.

To determine the number of police officers which have contributed to the Angela Rayner investigation would require us to manually contact all officers. If they have contributed, we would then need the officer to confirm how much time they have spent on the investigation. As working on investigations is part of their duties as GMP officers this information cannot be guaranteed and therefore will not be accurate.

To determine the cost of the Angela Rayner investigation would firstly require us to have the accurate amount of officers and time spent. We would then need to manually review all individual officers' personal records for pay details to manually calculate the total cost.

As such due to the extent of the searches required it is anticipated to exceed the 18 hour cost limit.

Therefore, as per section 12(1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, the cost of providing you with the information is above the amount to which we are legally required to respond i.e. the cost of locating and retrieving the information exceeds the 'appropriate level' as stated in the Freedom of Information (Fees and Appropriate Limit) Regulations 2004.

In accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000, this letter acts as a Refusal Notice.

However, in accordance with Section 16(1) – the duty to provide advice and assistance – of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, Greater Manchester Police will be unable able to provide advice for you to reduce the request in order for the force to keep this within the fees limit.
