FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST REFERENCE NO: 01/FOI/24/013463/M

I write in connection with your request for information dated 15/10/2024, received by Greater Manchester Police (GMP) for the following information:

- 1. Please could you provide information on how many officers have had disciplinary proceedings for discriminatory behaviour on the basis of race from the years 2022 up until the most recent data available for 2024? Please can you specify what unit or department each officer is from, and a brief summary of the allegation that was lodged against them, even if it's just one line to specify what was allegedly said or done?*
- 2. Out of the officers who have had disciplinary proceedings in the years specified, how many were dismissed without notice? Please can you specify what unit or department each officer is from, and a brief summary of the allegation that was lodged against them?*
- 3. Out of the officers who have had disciplinary proceedings in the years specified, how many retired or resigned? Please can you specify what unit or department each officer is/was from, and a brief summary of the allegation that was lodged against them?*

Result of Searches

Following receipt of your request searches were conducted within Greater Manchester Police (GMP) to locate information relevant to your request. I can confirm that the information you have requested is held by GMP. However, I am not obliged to supply you with the information as an exemption applies.

Section 17 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 requires Greater Manchester Police, when refusing to provide such information (because this information is exempt) to provide you, the applicant, with a notice which: (a) states that fact, (b) specifies the exemption in question and

(c) states (if that would not otherwise be apparent) why the exemption applies. The information you have requested in questions 2 and , as well as some of the information requested in question 1 is exempt from disclosure by virtue of the following exemption: **Section 40(2) – Personal Information.**

Where Section 40 has been used, this represents information that identifies a living individual, to disclose this information would breach the principles of the GDPR and the Data Protection Act 2018. Personal data is defined by Article 4 of the GDPR and Part 1 of the Data Protection Act 2018 and means any information relating to an identified or identifiable natural person ('data subject'). An identified natural person is one who can be identified directly or indirectly from that data.

In accordance with the Section 17 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, this letter acts as a Refusal Notice for that information.

The information requested in question 1 about the number of cases is not exempt. I can confirm that there have been 3 such cases.
