I write in connection with your request for information dated 25/09/2024, received by Greater Manchester Police (GMP) for the following information:

I am [REDACTED] in the Rusholme area, as part of our monthly Location risk assessment we include crime over the last month in the local area. we generally got this information for the crime.co.uk site but this hasn't been updated. please can you provide us with a crime update in the local area through out September please

Result of Searches

Following receipt of your request searches were conducted within Greater Manchester Police (GMP) to locate the requested information and I can confirm the information requested is held by GMP.

Caveats:

In July 2019, GMP implemented one of the largest IT infrastructure changes in UK policing. The systems are in continual development and the data provided for this request is what the systems currently hold.

- This data contains crimes which occurred on the reported beats A2D1-Rusholme West; A2D4-Rusholme and A2D5-Rusholme East with a created date between 01/09/2024 and 26/09/2024, excluding cancelled crimes. Further information about cancelled crimes can be obtained from the Home Office Counting Rules.
- We are aware of various system issues affecting crimes committed at locations for new and migrated crimes (see below for details). These issues mean that data for a specific location may include crimes that did not happen in that location and/or exclude crimes that did.
 - Some crimes do not have a beat code, which means that they cannot be mapped to other geographies e.g. districts.

- Some crimes have an incorrect beat code, which means that they are mapped to the wrong geographies.
- Some crimes do not have an address because e.g. the address has been recorded in a non-standard format or as map coordinates.

Due to some low results, some data has been replaced with X as by providing all the information you have requested would significantly increase the likelihood of identifying the individual(s) concerned, and as such the exemption under S40(2) – Personal Information, would be engaged and result in information being refused. By replacing the data this way it can be provided in its entirety.
