I write in connection with your request for information dated 24/09/2025, received by Greater Manchester Police (GMP) for the following information:

Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, I would like to request data regarding reported incidents of vehicle damage and theft from the car park location:

***Pure Gym,
208-218 Bury New Road
Manchester
M8 8DY***

Could you please provide the data for the period 01/09/2022 – 31/08/2025:

- The total number of reported incidents of cars being broken into & items stolen per 12 month period, 3 years in total.

If any part of this request is unclear, please let me know.

Result of Searches

Following receipt of your request searches were conducted within Greater Manchester Police (GMP) to locate the requested information. I can confirm the information requested is held by GMP.

Caveats:

In July 2019, GMP implemented one of the largest IT infrastructure changes in UK policing. The systems are in continual development and the data provided for this request is what the systems currently hold.

The incident data contains incidents with a postcode of M8 8DY and a closure code of C07, with a created date between 01/09/2022 and 31/08/2025, excluding incidents with a closing code of L10 Duplicate, L19 Error or L22 Test or training.

We are aware of system issues affecting **locations for incidents** (see below for details). These issues mean that data for a specific location may include incidents that did not happen in that location and/or exclude incidents that did.

- Some incidents do not have an address because e.g. the address has been recorded in a non-standard format or as map coordinates.

The crime data contains crimes with a postcode of M8 8DY and a Home Office code of 045/10, with a created date between 01/09/2022 and 31/08/2025, excluding cancelled crimes and crimes classified as fraud. Further information about cancelled crimes can be obtained from the Home Office Counting Rules. Details regarding fraud crime can be obtained by contacting the NFIB.

We are aware of various system issues affecting **committed at locations for new and migrated crimes** (see below for details). These issues mean that data for a specific location may include crimes that did not happen in that location and/or exclude crimes that did.

- Some crimes do not have an address because e.g. the address has been recorded in a non-standard format or as map coordinates.

There is a total of 16 'Theft from a motor vehicle' crimes recorded.
