FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST REFERENCE NO: FOI/26/017328/Q

I write in connection with your request for information dated 28/07/2026, received by Greater Manchester Police (GMP) for the following information:

I've been instructed to produce a Crime Impact Statement as part of a planning application for a proposed residential development on land at [REDACTED], Wythenshawe, Greater Manchester, and I believe the site lies within both the Hale Barns and Baguley neighbourhood policing areas.

Can I please ask you to provide the crime types and numbers of recorded crimes between June 1st 2023 and May 31st 2026 for both the Hale Barns and Baguley neighbourhood policing areas? Would it also be possible to break the data down, so each year is shown separately please, i.e. 1/6/23 to 31/5/24, 1/6/24 to 31/5/25, and 1/6/25 to 31/5/26, within a separate table for each area?

Result of Searches

Following receipt of your request searches were conducted within Greater Manchester Police (GMP) to locate the requested information. I can confirm the information requested is held by GMP.

Caveats:

In July 2019, GMP implemented one of the largest IT infrastructure changes in UK policing. The systems are in continual development and the data provided for this request is what the systems currently hold.

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- We are aware of various system issues affecting committed at locations for new and migrated crimes (see below for details) These issues mean that data for a specific location may include crimes that did not happen in that location and/or exclude crimes that did.
- Some crimes do not have a beat code, which means that they cannot be mapped to other geographies e.g. districts.
- Some crimes have an incorrect beat code, which means that they are mapped to the wrong geographies.
- Some crimes do not have an address because e.g. the address has been recorded in a non-standard format or as map coordinates.

Any count that has value less than 5 has been mark 'X'. They have been exempted from disclosure under **Section 40(2) Personal Information** – this information constitutes personal data of an identifiable living individual, and to disclose this information would breach the principles of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) and the Data Protection Act 2018. Personal data is defined by Section 1 of the Data Protection Act 2018 and means data that relates to an individual who can be identified directly or indirectly from that data.
