FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST REFERENCE NO: 01/FOI/26/017368/Y

I write in connection with your request for information dated 04/08/2026, received by Greater Manchester Police (GMP) for the following information:

Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, I am writing to request the following information:

1. Stolen property from residential properties

For the period 1 January 2024 to the date this request is processed, please provide data relating to the following categories of property reported as Stolen or Stolen & Recovered from residential properties (private dwellings):

- **Jewellery**
- **Watches**
- **Ornaments/objects d'art**
- **Paintings, drawings, tapestries and other artwork**

For each category, please provide:

- a. The number of items recorded as stolen or stolen and recovered.*
- b. The total recorded value of those items, where available.*
- c. A monthly breakdown of the number of items recorded as stolen or stolen and recovered, where readily available.*

2. Highest-value stolen items

Please provide details of the 10 highest-value items, where a value has been recorded, reported stolen from residential properties (private dwellings) between 1 January 2024 and the date this request is processed, including:

- a. The estimated value of the item.*
- b. A brief description of the item.*
- c. The year in which the theft was recorded.*

Result of Searches

Following receipt of your request searches were conducted within Greater Manchester Police (GMP) to locate the requested information and I can confirm the information requested is held by GMP.

However, GMP does not hold the information that you have requested in an easily retrievable format

For GMP to be able to provide a response to this request it will require a substantial manual review of all the recorded residential burglary crimes for the time periods requested. Our systems do not have a searchable field to be able to easily determine what items have been stolen/taken and so a review would be the only way to extract this information. For the time frame you have requested, there have been over 24,000 records logged and so to review each one would far exceed the 18hr permitted to provide this information.

Therefore, as per **Section 12(1)** of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, the cost of providing you with the information is above the amount to which we are legally required to respond i.e. the cost of locating and retrieving the information exceeds the 'appropriate level' as stated in the Freedom of Information (Fees and Appropriate Limit) Regulations 2004.

In accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000, this letter acts as a Refusal Notice.

GMP is obligated, pursuant to section 16(1) of the Act to provide you with advice and assistance on refining your request to bring compliance within the fees limit. In order for the force to attempt to keep this within the fees limit, the information you are requesting will need revising with a reduced time frame. With any request that requires a manual review there is always a chance of a request being refused under S12 due to the enormity of work that is usually needed to provide the data, therefore the resulting response cannot be guaranteed at this point as it will be dependent upon the number of records that fall within the scope of any new request, as they would still have to be manually assessed.
