**FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST REFERENCE NO: 01/FOI/26/016208/F**

I write in connection with your request for information dated 18/01/2026, received by Greater Manchester Police (GMP) for the following information:

*I am starting a YouTube channel called [REDACTED] The specific content I'm after is women or men that don't comply with the law over something silly. For example an establishment that have asked a certain customer to leave and they end up getting arrested due their own silly actions.*

*Traffic stops also where it could be so simple, but due to how the person behaves they get arrested. I'd like some body cam footage also of traffic stops, where the subject is intoxicated.*

*I'm not sure if it's the same over here as it is in the states to ask for body cam footage for content purposes here.*

*I will be blurring faces and redirect all confidential information. Or I don't know if you redact that yourselves, I'm not sure how this works.*

*My channel will be teaching people to just comply with the police.*

**Result of Searches**

Following receipt of your request searches were conducted within Greater Manchester Police (GMP) to locate information relevant to your request. I can confirm that the information you have requested is held by GMP.

However, GMP does not hold the information that you have requested in an easily retrievable format. To provide the data requested would involve a manual search of all saved body worn

video footage to establish if it is relevant to your request. Body worn video is linked to specific crime numbers and people. It is not possible to search by type of incident.

Given the many hours of saved body worn video footage we hold, to comply with the whole of your request the process would take well over 18 hours' work which exceeds the appropriate limit of £450.00, the amount to which we are legally required to respond.

As per section 12(1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, the cost of providing you with the information is therefore above the amount to which we are legally required to respond i.e. the cost of locating and retrieving the information exceeds the 'appropriate level' as stated in the Freedom of Information (Fees and Appropriate Limit) Regulations 2004.

In accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000, this letter acts as a Refusal Notice.

GMP is obligated, pursuant to section 16(1) of the Act to provide you with advice and assistance on refining your request to bring compliance within the fees limit. In order for the force to keep this within the fees limit, the information that you are requesting will need to relate to specific incidents. The resulting response cannot be guaranteed at this point as it will be dependent upon the number of records that fall within the scope of any new request, as they would still have to be manually assessed.
