I write in connection with your request for information dated 11/02/2026, received by Greater Manchester Police (GMP) for the following information:

Can I ask:

- 1) In 2023, 2024 and 2025 (calendar years), how many hit-and-run cases were reported to your force?*
- 2) In 2023, 2024, and 2025 (calendar years), how many hit-and-run casualties were recorded by your force?*
- 3) In 2023, 2024, and 2025 (calendar years), how many hit-and-run fatalities were recorded by your force?*

Result of Searches

Following receipt of your request searches were conducted within Greater Manchester Police (GMP) to locate information relevant to your request. I can confirm that the information you have requested is held by GMP.

CAVEATS

The Collision Recording and Sharing System will query data based on whether the field 'Hit and Run Stats 20' is showing 'Yes'.

In the vehicle record, officers code whether each vehicle:

- Remained at the scene, or*
- Left the scene before details were exchanged / police arrived*

If a vehicle is coded as "left scene", analysts commonly describe the collision as a hit and run.

A vehicle being recorded as “left the scene” does not automatically mean:

- The driver committed a criminal offence*
- The driver failed to report the collision later*
- The driver was traceable or untraceable*

For example:

- A driver may leave the scene but report within 24 hours*
- A driver may leave due to injury or danger*
- The vehicle may be unknown or untraced*

Our systems does not capture those outcomes.
